RAM4X (SSM-72H) Wireless Remote Access Microphone





NOTE

To connect the **SSM-72H** (**RAM4X**), the **SCU-30** Wireless Access Point firmware must be Ver. 2.00.00 or later.

The RAM4X (SSM-72H) allows remote control for all functions (Except "SPEAKER SELECT" in the CONFIGURATION SETUP MENU), of the enabled Standard Horizon fixed mount VHF radio. The full dot matrix display and programmable keys make operations quick and easy. Additional features include a Water activated Emergency Strobe Light, a MOB (Man Over-Board) function, and all DSC functions including Distress Signaling. Utilizing the optional SCU-30 Wireless Access Point, up to four RAM4X (SSM-72H) Wireless Remote Access Microphones may be connected to a fixed mount VHF radio.

The details for the installation and operation of the RAM4X (SSM-72H) are included in the Owner's Manual of the compatible fixed mount VHF radio, or the Owner's Manual can be downloaded at www.standardhorizon.com.


Safety Precautions (Be Sure to Read)

Be sure to read the safety precautions printed in the Operating Manual of the compatible fixed mount VHF radio to use this product safely.

NOTE

This instruction manual uses illustrations of the GX6000 display screen to explain the transceiver operating procedures.

Front and Rear Panel



1 Power/VOL knob

Press and hold this knob to turn the **RAM4X** remote microphone ON or OFF. Turn the knob to adjust the speaker volume.

2 DIAL/ENT knob

While the normal operating screen is displayed, rotate the **DIAL/ENT** knob to select the desired channel. While the MENU screen is displayed, rotate the knob to select the desired menu item.

Secondary use:

Press this knob to enter a selection in the MENU.

3 SQL key (Squelch control)

Press this key to activate the squelch adjustment mode. Press the [CH▲] or [CH▼] key to adjust the squelch level.

(4) PTT (Push-To-Talk) switch

Press this switch to enable transmit.

5 CLEAR/On key

Press this key to cancel a menu selection. Press and hold this key to activate the key lock function.

Press and hold this key again to deactivate the key lock function.

6 Microphone

Yaesu Clear Voice Noise Reduction Technology will reduce the transmitted background noise, when speaking into the microphone.

Note: Position your mouth about 1/2" (1.5 cm) away from the microphone aperture and speak in a normal voice.

⑦ ◀ & ► keys

Press these keys to switch the function menu.

Secondary use:

While the MENU screen is displayed, press the key to shift the on-screen menu to the right/left side.

8 MENU key

Press this key to access the MENU.

These keys are used to change the operating channel.

Press the key momentarily, to increase/decrease the channel one step. Holding the key, increases/decreases the channel number continuously.

Secondary use:

- While the MENU screen is displayed, press the key to shift the on-screen menu upward/downward.
- When in the PA or Fog mode, press the key to change the channel.

10 Display

Full dot matrix display (222 x 162 pixels).

11) Soft keys

These three programmable keys can be customized using the setup menu mode. When pressing one of these keys briefly, the key functions will appear at the bottom of the display.

12 Strobe LED

When the [STROBE] soft key is pressed, the Strobe LED will light or flash repeatedly. When the RAM4X comes in contact with water, the Strobe LED will light or flash to assist in locating the RAM4X in low light conditions.

13 **16/S** key

Pressing this key immediately recalls channel 16 from any channel location. Holding down this key recalls the SUB channel (The default setting is channel 9). Pressing this key again reverts to the previous selected working channel.

(14) Speaker

The internal speaker is located here.

15 DISTRESS key

This key is used to send a DSC distress call.

16 USB jack

Use the micro USB type B jack to connect the SSM-72H (RAM4X) battery charger.

NOTES

- The RAM4X is only floating / submersible* when the USB jack is properly sealed with jack cover.
 *(IPX8 Specification for submersibility: 4.92 ft. (1.5 m) for 30 minutes.)
- Make sure that there is no dust, dirt or crack on the jack or the rubber gasket.
- Remove any dust and dirt before closing the cover.
- If you find any cracks on the jack cover or gasket, please contact Standard Horizon or your local dealer to purchase a replacement.
- To keep the LCD, keypad and speaker grill clean and in top operating condition after exposure
 to water: Clean the RAM4X with fresh water after exposure to salt water by rinsing the RAM4X
 under a sink faucet or by dunking the RAM4X in a bucket of fresh water. After washing, use a
 soft cloth and thoroughly dry all parts of the RAM4X.

Belt Clip Installation / Removal

- To install the Belt Clip CLIP-22, align it to the groove of the rear panel, then press the Belt Clip downward until it locks in place with a "Click".
- To remove, pull the CLIP-22 latch tab away from the rear panel to unlock the CLIP-22, then slide the CLIP-22 upward to remove it.



Battery Charging

If the battery has never been used, or its charge is depleted, charge the **RAM4X** according to the following procedures:

- 1. Turn the RAM4X OFF.
- 2. Slide the USB jack cover button down to open the cover.
- 3. Referring to the figure at the right, connect the supplied USB Cable to the USB jack.



A fully discharged RAM4X will be charged completely in approximately 4 hours.When charging is completed, the battery charging icon will disappear.



CAUTION

Waterproof and floating features of the **RAM4X** are assured only when the USB jack cover is locked completely.

The SAD-17 or SDD-14 is NOT designed to be waterproof. Charge the radio in a dry location.

Battery Safety



When the " _____ " icon appears, it is recommended that you charge the battery soon.

WARNING

If the RAM4X will be unused for a long period of time, be sure to fully charge the built-in battery before storing it. When the RAM4X is stored for an extended period, recharge the built-in battery every six months to prevent it from over-discharging.

Connecting the RAM4X and the Transceiver

Once the transceiver and the **RAM4X** have been connected, and the settings have been stored to each other, when both are turned ON, they are automatically connected. Up to four **RAM4X** remote microphones can be connected at the same time.

WARNING

Keep the device away from 802.11b/g/n Wi-Fi devices, Bluetooth devices, cordless phones, transformers, heavy-duty motors, fluorescent lights, microwave ovens, and refrigerators to prevent signal interference or loss.

 When the RAM4X is turned ON for the first time after purchase, the WI-FI SETUP screen will be displayed automatically.



(RAM4X Screen)

Press the [YES] soft key on the RAM4X to display the WPS screen.



(RAM4X Screen)

3. Press and hold the **POWER** switch on the transceiver for about 10 seconds until the WPS screen is displayed.

NOTE: If the SCU-30 is not connected to the transceiver, a warning screen will be displayed. In that case, press the [OK] soft key, check the connection between the transceiver and the SCU-30, and then perform step 3.



(Transceiver Screen)

Press the [WPS] soft key on both the transceiver and the RAM4X.

NOTE: If "Error!" appears on the screen, press the [**OK**] soft key, then perform step 1.



If "Subscribed" appears on both the transceiver and the RAM4X screens, the connection is completed.

Press the $[\mathbf{OK}]$ soft key to return to the normal operating screen. The signal strength of WI-FI is displayed with the antenna icon " $\P_{\mathbf{I}}$ ".

Once the connection is completed, when the transceiver and the **RAM4X** are turned ON, they will be connected automatically.

NOTE: To connect with two or more RAM4X microphones, repeat the same procedure as above, or connect with the RAM4X using the WI-FI SETUP screen (see Page 6 or Page 7) for the transceiver setup.





WI-FI SETUP MENU of the RAM4X

NOTE: If the MENU key on the RAM4X is pressed while searching for SCU-30 after turning on RAM4X, the WI-FI SETUP screen will be called directly.

WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup)

This menu item connects the **RAM4X** and the transceiver using the WPS function.

- 2. Press the [YES] soft key to display the WPS screen.
- Refer to "WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup)" in the WI-FI SETUP MENU of the transceiver (Page 9) to display the WPS screen on the transceiver.



 Connect the RAM4X and the transceiver by following the same procedure as described in the step 4 of "Connecting the RAM4X and the Transceiver" (Page 5).

When "Subscribed" is displayed, connection of the RAM4X and the transceiver is completed. Once the connection is completed, thereafter they will be connected automatically when the transceiver and the RAM4X are turned ON.

Up to four **RAM4X** remote microphones can be connected simultaneously to the transceiver.



CONNECTION

This menu item displays the information of the SCU-30 and the RAM4X that are previously connected, and can be connected to the SCU-30.

The information of the **SCU-30** is displayed. The "SYC" icon is shown on the right side on the currently connected **SCU-30**.

Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the desired SCU-30 from the list, and press the [SELECT] soft key.

The connection information of the selected SCU-30 is displayed.

- Deleting the SCU-30 from the list
 Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the SCU-30 that is not
 currently connected and then press the [DELETE] soft key
 to delete the SCU-30 from the list.
- Press the [CONNECT] soft key on the connection information screen to connect to the selected SCU-30.

If "Error!" appears on the screen, press the $[\mbox{\bf OK}]$ soft key, then perform step 1.

5. When "Connected" appears on the screen, press the [OK] soft key to return to the normal screen.



WI-FI SETUP MENU of the Transceiver

This menu is displayed only when the **SCU-30** is connected to the transceiver.

AP SETUP (Access Point SETUP)

This menu item displays the information of the **SCU-30** Wireless Access Point, and permits changing the setting.

[MENU] (Press and hold) → "WI-FI SETUP" → "AP SETUP" (GX2400)

Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the desired menu item, and then press the [SELECT] soft key.

NOTE: Settings of "SECURITY:" and "MAC ADDRESS:" items cannot be changed.

- In the "SSID:" and "PASSWORD:" items, use the DIAL/ENT knob and the [SELECT] soft key to enter characters, and then press the [FINISH] soft key to store the entry.



 In the "CH:" item, rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to set the WI-FI channel setting, and then press the [ENTER] soft key.

AUTO: Automatically selects WI-FI channel to be used 1~11: Use the set WI-FI channel

When all the desired settings have been entered, rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select "SAVE", then press the [SELECT] soft key to save the settings and return to the normal operating screen.





TERMINAL CONNECTION

This menu item displays the information of the RAM4X that the SCU-30 previously connected.

1. [MENU] (Press) *** "SETUP" *** "WI-FI SETUP" *** "TERMINAL CONNECTION" (GX6000)

[MENU] (Press and hold) *** "WI-FI SETUP" *** "TERMINAL CONNECTION" (GX2400)

The information of the **RAM4X** is displayed. The "SYC" icon is displayed at the right side of the currently connected **RAM4X**.

Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the RAM4X from the list, and press the [SELECT] soft key.

The connection information of the selected ${\bf RAM4X}$ is displayed.

- Deleting the RAM4X from the list
 Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the RAM4X that is not
 currently connected and then press the [DELETE] soft key
 to delete the RAM4X from the list.
- Press the [CLEAR] key to return to the normal operating screen. The signal strength of WI-FI is displayed with the antenna icon "%" i".







WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup)

These menu item settings connect the transceiver and RAM4X using the WPS function.

- 2. Press the [YES] soft key to display the WPS screen.
- Refer to "WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup)" of WI-FI SETUP MENU of the RAM4X (Page 6) to display the WPS screen of the RAM4X



 Connect the transceiver and the RAM4X using the procedure in step 4 of "Connecting the RAM4X and the Transceiver" (Page 5).

When "Subscribed" is displayed, connection of the transceiver and the RAM4X is completed. Once the connection is completed, they will be connected automatically whenever the transceiver and the RAM4X are turned ON.

Up to four **RAM4X** can be connected simultaneously to the transceiver.



Configuration Setup

RAM4X operation is same as the enabled radio. This makes operation of the radio and **RAM4X** microphone similar and much easier. The only difference is that the following three items are added to CONFIGURATION SETUP:

LAMP

This menu selection is used to setup the illumination time of the display and keypad. **NOTE**: This function is available for the GX6000 with the Radio firmware Ver2.00.06 or later and the AIS firmware Ver. 1.00.05 or later.

Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the desired setting ("5sec" is default).

OFF: Disables the display/keypad lamp illumination.

3/5/10/20/30sec: Illuminates the display/keypad for the selected time when any key is pressed.



CONTINUOUS: Illuminates the display/keypad continuously.

- 3. Press the [SELECT] soft key to store the selected setting.
- 4. Press the CLEAR/Om key to return to radio operation.

STROBE LED

When the **[STROBE]** soft key is pressed, the Strobe LED will light or flash repeatedly. When the **RAM4X** comes in contact with water, the Strobe LED will light or flash to assist in locating the **RAM4X** in low light conditions.

- Rotate the DIAL/ENT knob to select the desired setting from: "CONTONIOUS" (default setting), "SOS", "BLINK 1", "BLINK 2", or "BLINK 3".
